Our speaker will be ornithologist and educator Georgann Schmalz, who has helped many hundreds of people learn to improve their bird identification skills, both visual and auditory. Birding by ear adds a totally new dimension to birding, but it isn't always an easy skill to acquire. This presentation will explore that skill by examining the characteristics of bird songs, what to listen for, and how to hear birds better.

Don't miss this fascinating presentation. Each year red knots undertake a near miraculous 19,000 mile journey from one end of the earth to the other and back. In her book [The Narrow Edge](#), Deborah Cramer accompanies them on their extraordinary odyssey along the length of two continents, tracking birds from remote Tierra del Fuego to the icy Arctic, and walking moonlit beaches to find ancient horseshoe crabs, whose eggs fuel shorebird migration and whose blue blood safeguards human health. Join Cramer on the journey, to examine the critical role the Georgia and South Carolina coasts play in this story, and to explore what's at stake, for shorebirds, horseshoe crabs, and for us.

**Thanksgiving Trip to Belize – A Brief Bird Report**

I had the good fortune to spend 4 days in the heart of the Belizian jungle at Black Rock Lodge over the Thanksgiving holiday. Black Rock Lodge is located on the Macal River in the Mayan Mountains of Belize. Our rustic cabin was one of 14 situated along a rim overlooking the river and the mountains! What a breath-taking view! Black Rock boasts that one can see over 200 species of birds on the property.

The first day I had the special treat of seeing a nesting pair of Orange Breasted Falcons. Black Rock is one site that is being used to study this endangered falcon by the Peregrine Project.

During one early morning walk while enjoying the singing of the Melodious Black Birds, I spied a White Hawk soaring over the mountains, sighted a Slaty-tailed Trogon, spotted many Montezuma Oropendolas flying high in the trees and had the thrill of seeing all three species of Toucans: Collared Aracari, Emerald Toucanet and the Keel-billed Toucan! I also watched a pale-billed woodpecker work diligently to hollow out a tree for its nest.

The next day canoeing down the Macal River I added a number of birds to my life list including a Black-cheeked Woodpecker, Amazon Kingfisher, Groove-billed Ani, and a Yellow-faced Grassquit!

After birding early each morning, while enjoying a hearty breakfast on the deck, I reveled in watching many Red-legged Honeycreepers, Baltimore Orioles, Black-cowled Orioles and Olive-backed and Yellow-throated Euphonias at the fruit-filled bird feeders. Black Rock is a birders paradise!

I am already planning my return to the rain-forest of Belize!
